

Dr Katarzyna (Kasia) Zamara is a geotechnical engineer with experience working for international consultancies and contractors in Poland, UK and NZ. For the last three years, Kasia has worked on the manufacturing side of the geosynthetic industry. This sees her connecting with professionals and academics across Europe, Asia, Australasia, South Africa and North America.

Kasia has been an active member of IGS since 2009, organising IGS UK chapter seminars and later, after moving to NZ, organised the first IGS seminars in NZ in 2017 with support from the Australian Chapter of IGS.
